PROJECT370 CLAIRFIES STANCE ON VARIOUS MH370 ACCIDENT THEORIES

Following the announcement by Project370 of its mission, several contacts have been made with the project co-ordinator in regard to requests for comment on the sequence of events that led to the loss of Malaysian Airlines flight MH370 on 8 March 2014.

“There can be no question of Project370 volunteers, nor for that matter, any other responsible parties interested in aviation safety, being able to detail what transpired aboard the flight MH370 airliner until the aircraft is found.” the project co-ordinator, Mark D. Young said this morning.

“In order to factually and accurately investigate any airliner loss you first need physical evidence. The best data is always provided by the aircraft itself. Until you have that, or at the very least its flight recorders, any speculation is irresponsible.”

“Accordingly, I re-iterate the stance of the Project's founding documents that its sole purpose is to evaluate possible locations where the airliner may be and to commission surveys to locate it. We will not, and cannot, make any comment on the myriad theories postulated in regard to the accident as neither the volunteers, nor anyone else as far as we are aware, has definitive, factual information about the events on board the aircraft that led to its loss.”

“We are, as a first resort, following the factual evidence trail from the recovered debris as that is all there is to go on. However, as we stated when we reached out to various people to join the project's efforts, anyone with provable, scientific evidence which casts new light on possible target areas to search, is welcome to get in touch.” he concluded.

Project370 is appealing to the world's public to assist the volunteers by offering donations towards the costs of the proposed sea surveys to locate the missing airliner.

Project370 is collating all available data on possible locations of 9M-MRO and – donations permitting - will commission sea surveys on a priority basis to scan identified areas until, it is hoped, the location of the aircraft can be determined.

All costs of running and establishing the entity thus far have been, and will be, absorbed by its volunteers.

Upon a successful conclusion of the project, the entity's founding documents and constitution provide for the donation of any surplus donations in its accounts to ICAO for the improvement of over-water tracking technology used on the world's civil aviation fleet.
